Bayou Greenways 2020

- 1,500 additional acres of greenspace and parkland, uniting 9 bayous
- 150 miles of connected, continuous, safe, off-street trails
- 6 out of 10 Houstonians will live within a 1.5 miles of the trails
- Mitigates stormwater runoff, flooding, enhances water quality
- \$215 million project (PPP)







OPTIMIZING BUILDING PERFORMANCE: 4 COMPONENTS



BENCHMARKING

Measuring building energy and water efficiency.

Building owners track and report their energy and water usage annually in ENERGY STAR® Portfolio Manager, a free online tool.



TRANSPARENCY

Track use trends to drive improvements in building efficiency.

Building owners share energy and water use data with the City utilizing the ENERGY STAR® Portfolio Manager system.



BUILDING AUDIT

Identify and quantify opportunities to reduce energy and water use.

Building owners submit a summary audit report that certifies an energy and water audit was completed.



TRAINING

Workforce Development: Increase capacity of operators through training Building owners document that the facility is operated by a qualified individual.




